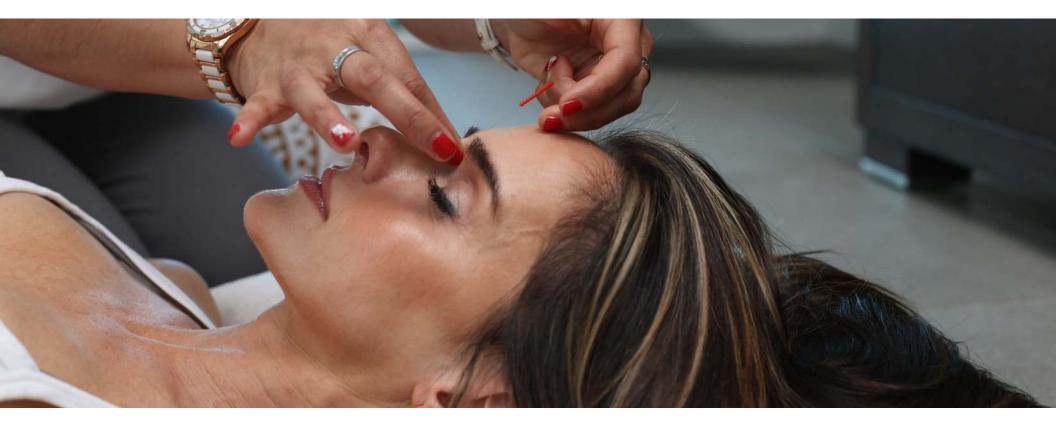
## Write down the first answers that come to mind for the following questions:

- 2. If most of us are motivated by love (love for our families, friends, selves, etc) or status (security, stability, foundation)- how does what you offer help solve those needs?
- 3. If you went to connect with your typical customer on social media, which platform would you start with? Which platform would you visit second?
- 4. Who does your customer follow online? What groups do they belong to?
- 5. Where does your customer spend their time offline? Doing what? With whom?

6. How does your buyer see themselves today? How do they WANT to see themselves in the future?



- 7. What causes does your customer believe in?
- 8. Where does your customer shop? What brands do they love?
- 9. Think of your biggest superfan customer. How would you specifically describe them to a friend?



Buyer Avatar Framework:
