anxious, worried, annoyed, confused or any other negative emotion? MUTE THAT PERSON. If you don't know that person, UNFOLLOW THEM. Unsubscribe to what is not nourishing your mind just like you stay away from unhealthy foods that do not nourish your body.

Pro tip: If you are someone who struggles with tossing that old sweater into the Goodwill bag because WHAT IF someday you decide you liked it after all- guess what?
